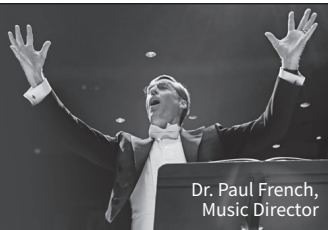
My belief is that great art becomes even greater when many hands participate in its creation. Artistic collaborations are a wonderful way to involve exceptional musical minds in transforming good into great.

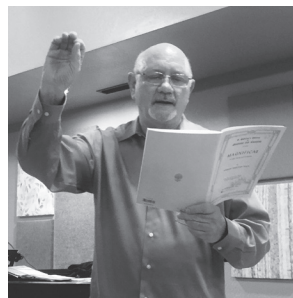

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

The Holiday Season

Ah, yes – it's that time of year when we prepare for the onslaught of holidays starting in late October and ending in January of the next year: Halloween, Thanksgiving, Kwanzaa, Hanukkah, Festivus, Yuletide, Christmas, New Year and a host of other religious and secular celebrations now mark our calendars with social gatherings, costumed characters, shopping, religious services, holiday music, and more rich food than we can, or should, possibly consume. It's the holidays, also known as the holiday season, Christmas season, or sometimes the festive season. These three-months, plus, is full of anticipation, planning, gift giving, and visits to family and friends far and near. This concert, "Home for the Holidays," celebrates our annual gatherings of family and friends for these precious holidays. Some of us will need to travel some distance for these gatherings, some will be near to home. We anticipate these important gatherings of joy, love, and for some, a bit of trepidation. In general, these gatherings remind us of who we are, our heritage, and our communities.

I chose to highlight those holidays most recognized by our Western culture for this concert, starting with Thanksgiving, moving on to Hanukkah, Christmas, and finally New Years. The works are a combination of faith-based songs, folk songs, Christmas carols, and modern popular holiday songs presented in various national settings. The expansive *Fantasia on Christmas Carols* by iconic British composer Ralph Vaughan Williams tells the Christmas story with several classic British carols with a stunning baritone solo, that will be sung to perfection by Chris Thompson. The Rogue Valley Chorale Association's Cantare Chorus (grades 6, 7, and 8), is joining the Chorale in this holiday presentation. And, because the central theme for the concert is Home for the Holidays, this concert is in honor of, and dedicated to, the Armed Services men and women, both current and retired, some of whom have shared their stories with me about how they spent their Holiday Seasons while in the service for our country.

Cantare Chorus is an auditioned group of talented singers in grades 6-8 from around the Rogue Valley. Many of the singers began their choral experience in the Discovery or Children's Chorus and audition for Cantare with a desire to expand their musicianship and choral experience.

He earned his degree in music from Oregon State University. He began his career as a music educator in 2010. ARTISTIC DIRECTOR/CONDUCTOR MICHAEL MORRIS



Michael Morris is a seasoned voice teacher, conductor, and singer with over 40 years of professional experience. He has served on the music faculty at Holy Names College in Oakland, CA, Notre Dame de Namur University in Belmont, CA, Ohlone College in Fremont, CA, Santa Clara University, and De Anza College in Cupertino, CA. Michael has been the Music Director and Conductor for such diverse organizations as the Mission Peak Chamber Singers, Lyric Theatre of San Jose, CA, Los Altos Conservatory Theater, Los Altos United Methodist Church, Saint Jude's Episcopal Church in Cupertino, CA, and Saint Simon's Catholic Church in Los Altos, CA.

Michael is also a well-known and respected baritone soloist, having sung the leading roles in some 80 operas, operettas, and musicals with such companies as Opera San Jose, West Bay Opera, and Rogue Valley Opera. He is a frequent soloist for concert work with large orchestras and choral organizations. A voice teacher for over 40 years, Michael is known as a "teacher's teacher" and instructs many professional singers and music teachers in his studio. Michael Morris Studio, LLC, has run continually since its founding in 1976. He is also an experienced clinician for voice, opera, choral workshops, as well as vocal master classes in repertoire, performance, and audition technique.

Michael received his Master of Music Degree in Vocal Performance from Notre Dame de Namur University and his Bachelor of Music Degree in Music Education from San Francisco State University. He studied opera at the American Institute of Music Studies in Graz, Austria, where he received the George London Award for Vocal Performance.

Michael recently relocated to the Rogue Valley with his wife Linda, who now sings first alto in the Chorale. We are thrilled that Michael shares his exceptional educational, artistic, and directorial skills and experience with the Rogue Valley Chorale and anticipate many years of creating and sharing outstanding choral music in the Rogue Valley — and beyond.

An inheritance enabled Jim to become a generous patron of the performing arts. Jim retired to Medford after teaching high school English in Delano, California (near Bakersfield) for 30 years. A group of friends introduced him to the opera, and he made frequent trips to Los Angeles to see spectacular performances featuring some of the world's finest singers. Opera deepened his interest in the performing arts. He began visiting Ashland to attend the Oregon Shakespeare Festival plays, a passion he shared with his students in California.

The term "arts in Southern Oregon" has become synonymous with the name Jim Collier. Our community is richer because of this tireless and dedicated philanthropist. We love you, Jim.

GUEST ARTIST



CHRIS THOMPSON, Baritone

Chris is a highly sought-after singer with a rich and versatile voice. He spans the range of genre from opera to musical theater, rock and roll to spirituals. He is one of Southern Oregon's favorite guest artists and has performed in numerous productions including Mendelssohn's *Elijah* and Handel's *Messiah* with the Rogue Valley Chorale, and *The Barber of Seville*, *Don Pasquale*, and *The Merry Widow* with Rogue Valley Opera.

Described as a "supremely nuanced" (*Gramophone*) and "a remarkable baritone" (*Opera News*), Chris Thompson is an international artist noted for compelling performances on stage and in the concert hall. He has performed leading lyric baritone roles ranging from Figaro in *Il Barbiere di Siviglia* to Carl Magnus in *A Little Night Music*. A strong advocate of new music, Chris made his Carnegie Hall debut singing *Posh*, a song cycle by composer Mohammed Fairouz, and played Daniel Keane in the Off-Broadway musical *Fermat's Last Tango* at NYC's York Theatre. His performances have been featured on recording labels such as: Naxos, Original Cast Recordings, Albany Records, Koch-Schwann, and Novana Records.



Chris developed a passion for singing at an early age. He sang in his church's children's choir and participated in the summer musical program at his home town college. He performed in his first opera in sixth grade. Chris attributes his success as a singer to the many people who guided his career along the way. "People were there for me when I needed them, to help me through rough passages or lift me up to the next level of my personal and professional growth." He says his greatest influences may not have been music, but the people who taught him about himself.

A devoted teacher (Professor of Music, Missouri State University), Chris' students win competitions, sing at major summer programs, and perform leading roles as young professionals. He makes a positive impact in the lives of his students by helping them become the best at who they are and allowing the journey toward musicality to emerge as musical story telling. Chris believes that the role of a singer is to co-mingle who they are with the vision of the composer so that the result is an honest and heart-felt representation of a composition.

ACCOMPANIST

MIKIKO S. PETRUCELLI



Mikiko S. Petrucelli was born in Tokyo, Japan where she first started playing piano at the age of 4. She attended the Mushashino Academia Musicae and received her undergraduate degree in Piano Performance. She then moved to Germany and earned a Performance Degree from the Hochschule für Musik in Detmold, Germany. After she returned to Japan, Mikiko played with the string chamber group Uovo as their guest pianist, touring Japan and giving chamber and solo concerts in Germany. She has played on NHK radio, the national public radio station in Japan, and won a special award at the Josef Dichter Competition in Vienna, Austria in 2001.

In 2004 Mikiko moved to the United States and received a Masters of Music from Baylor University and Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from the University of Nebraska, Lincoln.

In 2008, as a result of winning the Chiara Competition, Mikiko performed Dvorak's Piano Quintet with the Chiara Quartet. She has also studied Historical Performance Practice in fortepiano. In 2008, she was invited to an international conference, as a result of a complete Hixson-Lied Presentation of Scholarly and Creative Activity Grant. She attended an international conference "The Art of the Fortepiano" and performed in several concerts in Middleburg, the Netherlands.

Mikiko has extensive experience as a chamber and solo pianist as well as an accompanist. She served for three years as an adjunct faculty member at Doane College in Crete, Nebraska. Mikiko joined the Rogue Valley Chorale as accompanist in 2015.

CONDUCTOR EMERITUS LYNN SJOLUND

Lynn Sjolund, Founding Artistic Director/Conductor Emeritus of the Rogue Valley Chorale, served as Artistic Director from 1973 until 2013. During his tenure, the Chorale presented hundreds of concerts to the community, toured Europe seven times, performed at Carnegie Hall and made a lasting impact on the Rogue Valley community. The Rogue Valley Chorale singers will forever hold a place in their hearts for Conductor Emeritus Lynn Sjolund.
