### FROM THE CONDUCTOR

When I first contacted Bishop Mayfield to ask him to be a soloist in this gospel Christmas concert with the



Rogue Valley Chorale, he wanted to know what type of gospel music we were singing. I had already chosen music for this program, and yet I could not answer his guestion.

Part of my "education" for this concert was to watch a wonderful film, now available on YouTube called "The Story of Gospel Music: The Power in the Voice." Most of us know that gospel is a musical form deeply rooted in the rich traditions of the African-American church. The term "gospel" means "good news." It is music sung from the soul and from the heart. There isn't space to go into all of the history here, but one of the musical forms used in early gospel music was the "call and response" style, which you will hear in a number of our songs today. African Americans in the late 19th and early 20th centuries adapted hymns from the European tradition, but they found the confines of strict rhythm too restrictive. They stretched out the timing, and added elements of improvisation and syncopation.

In the 1930's Thomas Dorsey in Chicago infused his study of blues and jazz with traditional gospel music to create a style known as gospel blues. Southern gospel or quartet gospel used a small group of men singing in tight harmony, not unlike barbershop harmony. Traditional gospel features a more basic sound suited for choral groups, while contemporary gospel places more emphasizes solo artists. Praise and worship, which describes most of the pieces we bring you in this concert, combines both contemporary and traditional gospel styles. I'm not sure that we, as primarily White Anglo-Saxon Protestants, can give you an authentic sense of what is essentially an African-American form. Nevertheless, I am sure you will find that the joy and energy in this music is infectious.

This is the season of hope. In the program for our last concert, I wrote that it is my hope that the music we make will bring us together as a community and create a microcosm of harmony in a world that needs every bit of harmony we can bring to it. That is still my wish today. May your souls be stirred, and may you leave the theater with joy in your hearts.

# ARTISTIC DIRECTOR LAURIE HUNTER

Laurie Anne Hunter has been a friend of the Rogue Valley Chorale since 2002, long before becoming the organization's Artistic Director. She served on the Chorale Board, accompanied the Chorale on the pia



Chorale Board, accompanied the Chorale on the piano, and filled in as Guest Conductor when the need arose. Upon the retirement of Lynn Sjolund (now Conductor Emeritus), Laurie was enthusiastically nominated and selected as the Chorale's next Artistic Director.

A native of Pasadena, California, Laurie Anne Hunter received her B.A. from the University of Winnipeg and her Masters in Piano Accompanying from the Juilliard School in New York. She spent five seasons as an Assistant Conductor and Vocal Coach with the New York City Opera, becoming the fourth woman ever to conduct there when she made her Lincoln Center debut with Marc Blitzstein's *Regina* in 1992. Guest conducting appearances followed with the New England Lyric Operetta, Skylight Opera Theatre in Milwaukee, and the Kitchener-Waterloo Symphony.

She was Associate Conductor of *Phantom of the Opera* in Toronto and Showboat on Broadway. She has served as Assistant Conductor and Vocal Coach for the Opera Theatre of Saint Louis, Augusta Opera, Mobile Opera, Boston Concert Opera and the Metropolitan Opera Guild's educational productions. She was also head of the music staff for two years at the Banff Centre's Music Theater program in Canada. She worked with American Musical Theater of San Jose and the Seattle Opera before the Oregon Shakespeare Festival brought her to Ashland as Musical Director and Pianist for *Enter the Guardsman* in 2001. She has also served as Musical Director for the Oregon Cabaret Theater and Southern Oregon University's Department of Theater Arts.

Laurie has been on the faculty of the Hartt School of Music, the Israel Vocal Arts Institute in Tel Aviv, the Musicians Club of America summer Opera and Lieder Institutes in North Carolina, and is currently on the adjunct faculty at Southern Oregon University. She took up the harp while earning her certification from the "Music for Healing and Transition Program" and plays therapeutic harp music for Providence Cancer Center and Hospice in Medford. She is also the music director at the First Presbyterian Church in Ashland and maintains a private teaching studio for harp, singing and piano.

The Rogue Valley Chorale Association welcomes Laurie Anne Hunter's 3rd season as Artistic Director and Conductor.

#### MIKIKO S. PETRUCELLI, Accompanist

Mikiko S. Petrucelli was born in Tokyo, Japan where she first started playing piano at the age of 4. She attended the Mushashino Academia Musicae and received her undergraduate degree in Piano Performance. She then moved to Germany and earned a Performance Degree from the Hochschule für Musik in Detmold, Germany. After she returned to Japan, Mikiko played with the string chamber group Uovo as their guest pianist, touring Japan



and giving chamber and solo concerts in Germany. She has played on NHK radio, the national public radio station in Japan, and won a special award at the Josef Dichter Competition in Vienna, Austria in 2001.

In 2004 Mikiko moved to the United States and received a Masters of Music from Baylor University and Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from the University of Nebraska, Lincoln.

In 2008, as a result of winning the Chiara Competition, Mikiko performed Dvorak's Piano Quintet with the Chiara Quartet. She has also studied Historical Performance Practice in fortepiano. In 2008, she was invited to an international conference, as a result of a complete Hixson-Lied Presentation of Scholarly and Creative Activity Grant. She attended an international conference "The Art of the Fortepiano" and performed in several concerts in Middleburg, the Netherlands.

Mikiko has extensive experience as a chamber and solo pianist as well as an accompanist. As of May 2010, she completed three years of service at Doane College in Crete, Nebraska as an adjunct faculty member. She joined the Rogue Valley Chorale as accompanist in 2015.

#### **BISHOP MAYFIELD, Guest Soloist**

Bishop Mayfield entered the music scene in 1966 and has played with B.B. King, Al Wilson, Martha Reeves & The Vandella's, Ike & Tina Turner, John Lee Hooker, Big Brother & the Holding Company, Jose Feliciano, James Brown, Etta James, The Neville Brothers, and many more. Bishop currently appears with noted guitarist and songwriter Dave Storie in the powerfully dynamic "Bishop Mayfield Band" (*R&B, Funk, Blues-Rock, Fusion*) based in Southern Oregon. Bishop is currently in studio recording with platinum record producer Sylvia Massey at Radio Star Studios. Bishop has performed in noted venues throughout the county, and is



just as comfortable singing Gospel as he is singing Funk, Jazz, or Blues. Bishop is married to Suzette Mayfield and has 4 Children and 8 Grandchildren.

#### **BRITNEY SIMPSON, Guest Soloist**

Britney Simpson's love for singing, music, and faith started in the church at 8 years old, and by age 16 she made the choice to facilitate a career in the Performing Arts. In 2011, she joined the two-year program of the Pacific Conservatory of the Performing

Arts. There, she was featured in the productions of *The* Wizard of Oz as Dorothy, Fiddler on the Roof as Grandma Tzeitel, and Our Town as Myrtle Webb. After graduating in the spring of 2013 she started work that summer at Oregon Cabaret Theatre playing the role of Nina in the show S'wonderful, followed by her first season at the Oregon Shakespeare Festival in 2014. She has made Ashland her home for 3 seasons at OSF, in productions including The Wiz (Dorothy and Glinda), Yeomen of the Guard (Pheobe and Krazy Kate), Head Over Heels (Mopsa) and Guys & Dolls (ensemble). She has also been featured in the 2016 Britt Festival, 2014-16 Daedalus Projects, and several outside readings, including Blues For Mister Charlie and Force Continuum. She is thankful for the opportunity to harken back to the gospel that ignited her love of the arts and enjoys being a part of the passionate, supportive community of the Rogue Valley.



#### BRENT OLSTAD, Keyboard

Brent Olstad has played keyboards with a variety of groups including the Rogue Valley Gospel Group, the Jefferson State Jazz Coalition and the Southern Oregon Jazz Orchestra. He has also been the musical arranger and director for many of the Spotlight series at the Camelot Theater. He is a published music arranger and served as worship leader in several churches for the past 25 years. He is currently the Director of Joni and Friends Southern Oregon which hosts community events and provides resources for families affected by disability as well as training and disability awareness workshops for churches and schools



#### **REED BENTLEY, Percussion**

A graduate from the percussion program at SOU, Reed has been a musician for the Oregon Shakespeare Festival for multiple seasons with *Guys & Dolls* and *Into the Woods* and performed both shows at "The Wallis" theater in Beverly Hills, CA. He has performed with the Rogue Valley Symphony for over a decade, and has appeared with other orchestras in Northern California and Southern Oregon. Locally, Reed is a member of numerous music ensembles in the Rogue Valley.


