FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR LAURA RICH

When Michael Morris accepted the position of Artistic Director of the Rogue Valley Chorale Association, he spoke to me about his concept of expanding borders. As our season has progressed, I have witnessed the actualization of Michael's vision in various manifestations. Michael wants to reach out, to touch the lives of those who have never experienced the beauty and transformative power of music. He wants to climb out of the box and explore possibilities, challenge the status quo and break down barriers.



In 2015, the Rogue Valley Chorale performed Joseph Julian Gonzalez' *Misa Azteca*. We loved the oratorio and began discussing the possibility of commissioning a work from Mr. Gonzalez. The composition would be written in the Nahuatl (Aztec) language. During the composition process, Mr. Gonzalez brought to our attention the connection between the Aztec people and Oregon's Paiute nation. The Paiute trace their ancestry to the Aztec of Central Mexico, and, in fact, are descendants of the Nahuatl language family. Curiosity about the language family connection has resulted in a collaborative project with the Paiute Nation.

During the Ethereal Moments concert you will be the first to hear our commissioned composition, *Cuicapeuhcayotl (Origin of the Songs)*. The piece is the culmination of three years of planning, raising funds, composing and rehearsing. In the true spirit of Michael's vision of expanding borders, we will travel to Oregon's Paiute Reservation in Burns to perform the commissioned piece and to engage in a rich and rewarding cultural sharing experience. The Paiute children will share the stage with us to perform traditional drumming and dancing, a tribal elder will introduce the evening with a Paiute blessing, and we will share a meal together with the Paiute Tribal Council, during which gift exchanges will take place and expressions of gratitude for our mutual appreciation of and love for our Oregon home will be expressed. Tonight's concert, along with our outreach concert in Burns with our Paiute neighbors are perfect examples of expanding borders.

As someone who has been intimately involved in the project from its inception, I am beyond excited to share its premiere with you. My hope is that you will love *Cuicapeuhcayotl* as much as we do. Thank you for being here.

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

By Michael Morris, Artistic Director/Conductor

Ethereal

- 1: of or relating to the regions beyond the earth (celestial, heavenly, unworldly, spiritual)
- 2: lacking material substance (immaterial, intangible)

Have you ever had an "out of body experience"? Or perhaps you have experienced elation or "otherness" while on a nature walk, or while meditating, or in prayer, or just before waking up when



you are still in a dream state, but not really still asleep. I would venture to say that we all have had such an experience. This state is so recognized that poets, writers, painters, and yes, composers have attempted to express the moment with their artistry. Spiritual teachers, prophets, and the great humanitarians speak of these ethereal moments and places. The search for unworldliness, spirituality, celestial or heavenly understanding is a primary quest for all humankind.

I first spoke with composer Joseph Julian Gonzalez nearly a year ago about the Rogue Valley Chorale's commissioned work based on the text from an ancient Aztec epic poem, *Cantares Mexicanos*. Experts believe that this poem is the basis for the Aztec spiritual belief of the afterlife, or more accurately, the quest for the after-world, known as the "flower world". *Cantares Mexicanos* is a very long poem, and so Mr. Gonzalez chose only the first verse of the poem for the Chorale's commission. That first verse is known as *Cuicapeuhcayotl*, which means *Origin of the Songs*.

After our initial conversations, I began to form a theme for this concert based on the information that Mr. Gonzalez had given me about *Cantares Mexicanos* and my research of the poem. A word kept coming to mind as I pondered the poem's primary theme of the search for the celestial world. The word was "ethereal". I started a search for music that fit this theme of the ethereal and, to my amazement, there was so much music to draw from that there is enough repertoire for many, many concerts based on this idea of the ethereal. This concert has works by famous composers such as Haydn, Brahms, Randall Thompson, and Aaron Copland. There are also works by contemporary composers such as James McCray, Greg Bartholomew, and of course, Joseph Julian Gonzalez. The texts for these compositions come from the Bible, John Muir, Robert Frost, the Latin Catholic Mass, and naturally, *Cantares Mexicanos*. The words and music come from many eras, many cultures, and many languages. The concept of "ethereal moments" is universal, crossing the barriers of time, place, culture, and belief systems.

The music for this concert is uniformly exquisite. I encourage you to listen not only with your ears, but with your heart. If you find that it takes you away to an ethereal moment, then the beauty of the music, the words, and the performance have done their jobs.

Michael Morris is a seasoned voice teacher, conductor, and singer with over 40 years of professional experience. He has served on the music faculty as the

Director of Choral Activities and a member of the Voice Faculty at Holy Names College in Oakland, CA and Notre Dame de Namur University in Belmont, CA; as well as serving on the Music Faculty at Ohlone College in Fremont, CA; Santa Clara University, and De Anza College in Cupertino, CA. Michael has been the Music Director and Conductor for such diverse organizations as the Mission Peak Chamber Singers, Lyric Theatre of San Jose, CA, Los Altos Conservatory Theater, Los Altos United Methodist Church, Saint Jude's Episcopal Church in Cupertino, CA, and Saint Simon's Catholic Church in Los Altos, CA.

Michael is also a well-known and respected baritone soloist, having sung the leading roles in some 80 operas, operettas, and musicals with such companies as Opera San Jose, West Bay Opera, and Rogue Valley Opera. He is a frequent soloist for concert work with large orchestras and choral organizations. A voice teacher for over 40 years, Michael is known as a "teacher's teacher" and instructs many professional singers and music teachers in his studio, Michael Morris Studio, LLC, that has run continually since its founding in 1976. He is also an experienced clinician for voice, opera, choral workshops, as well as vocal master classes in repertoire, performance, and audition technique.

Michael received his Master of Music Degree in Vocal Performance from Notre Dame de Namur University and his Bachelor of Music Degree in Music Education from San Francisco State University. He studied opera at the American Institute of Music Studies in Graz, Austria where he received the George London Award for Vocal Performance

Michael recently relocated to the Rogue Valley with his wife Linda, who now sings first alto in the Chorale. We are thrilled that Michael shares his exceptional educational, artistic, and directorial skills and experience with the Rogue Valley Chorale and anticipate many years of creating and sharing outstanding choral music in the Rogue Valley and beyond.










ACCOMPANIST

received her undergraduate degree in Piano Performance. She then moved to Germany and earned a Performance Degree from the Hochschule für Musik in Detmold, Germany. After she returned to Japan, Mikiko played with the string chamber group Uovo as their guest pianist, touring Japan and giving chamber and solo concerts in Germany. She has played on NHK radio, the national public radio station in Japan, and won a special award at the Josef Dichter Competition in Vienna. Austria in 2001.

In 2004 Mikiko moved to the United States and received a Masters of Music from Baylor University and Doctor of Musical Arts in Piano Performance from the University of Nebraska, Lincoln.

In 2008, she was invited to an international conference, as a result of a complete Hixson-Lied Presentation of Scholarly and Creative Activity Grant. 

John Muir (1838-1914)


Climb the mountains and get their good tidings.




