Let Freedom Sing

February 26, 8 p.m. and February 27, 3 p.m. First Presbyterian Church, 85 S. Holly, Medford, Oregon

In the second concert of the season, solists and ensembles from the Chorale will perform songs of freedom from around the world. Songs of Eastern Europe, Africa and the United States will be featured as well as the short cantata *They Called Her Moses*, adapted and arranged from several Black American spirituals by Robert DeCormier.

The Gondoliers

One of Gilbert and Sullivan's most popular and tuneful musicals will be the final programs of the '93-'94 season. Solists from the Chorale will sing the parts and tell the story in a concert version of the convoluted story. You won't want to miss this hilarious musical hit of one hundred years ago. Sir Arthur Sullivan, touted as the "English Mozart" displayed a talent for melodic characterization which make each operetta sparkle.

About the Chorale

Founded in 1973, the Rogue Valley Chorale has gained a reputation for excellence in many kinds of choral music. Often the group has appeared at the Peter Britt Festival and was recently featured in Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms*. Noted for its performances of major works, the group has performed the Bach *Mass in b minor* and requiems of Brahms, Verdi, Rutter, Mozart and Faure in addition to many other extended pieces. Last summer 48 members of the Chorale performed to enthusiastic audiences in Austria, The Czech Republic and Hungary as part of their twentieth anniversary celebration. While in Hungary they appeared as featured guests of the city of Veszprem in the first Hungarian-American Choral Festival.

Lynn Sjolund, founding director of the Chorale, conducts for the Rogue Opera and has conducted choral festivals in many states. As a music educator he has been awarded national and northwest honors.
