LYNN SJOLUND

Lynn Sjolund has been the music director and conductor of the Rogue Valley Chorale since its organization in 1973. He has earned music degrees from the University of Oregon and has spent a year studying in Germany. Mr. Sjolund is president-elect of the Oregon Music Educators Association, vice-president of the Arts Council of Southern Oregon, past president of the Jackson County Community Concert Association, and chairman of the fine arts department of Medford Senior High School. As director of the Medford High Choir, Mr. Sjolund has led his groups in performances on NBC Radio and for many local, state and northwest conventions. He has been choral director of the Peter Britt Chorale, and his groups have made many appearances at the Peter Britt Festivals.

VERONICA ROTH FINIGAN

Veronica Roth Finigan is chorale accompanist for the Fall Concert Season. She holds a Bachelor of Art degree from Goshen College, Goshen, Indiana. Mrs. Finigan also has a special diploma in Piano Pedagogy from the New School for Music Study in Princeton, New Jersey. Mrs. Finigan was Director of the Department of Piano Pedagogy at Goshen College for three years, and has completed graduate work in Music Education at the University of Oregon in Eugene.

KATHLEEN DAVIS

Mrs. Davis holds a Bachelor of Arts degree from Lawrence University, Appleton, Wisconsin. She studied at the Piano Conservatory there, and went on to obtain her Master of Arts degree at Reed College in Portland. Besides being the mother of three children, she is currently teaching piano here in the Rogue Valley.

KATHRYN GORDON

Coloratura soprano, Kathryn Gordon, is a musical product of the Rogue Valley, being born and raised in Grants Pass. She received her formal music training at the University of Oregon and in Portland with the Portland Opera Association's former conductor, the late Herbert Weiskopf. Mrs. Gordon has been a member of the Rogue Valley Chorale since its beginning and frequently performs as a soloist. Musical appearances in the Rogue Valley include the Rogue Valley Symphony, the annual SOSC production of Handel's Messiah, and several seasons with the Peter Britt Music Festival. Mrs. Gordon has recently resumed vocal studies with her former teacher, Exine Bailey and the University of Oregon.

STEVE SIMMONS

As a youth, Steve Simmons had keyboard training and later participated in his high school instrumental program. Mr. Simmons attended the University of Chicago, where he majored in English and sang in the Collegium Musicum. Mr. Simmons is often heard as soloist in the Chorale and at the First Presbyterian Church, where he is associate pastor.

NICK TENNANT

Nick is a printer, who also raises Jersey dairy cattle. He has been singing since the age of six. He has performed in the Rogue Valley as soloist with the Rogue Valley Chorale and the Britt Festival. In recent productions he sang El Gallo in "The Fantasticks" and Gastone in "La Traviata."

CHRISTOPHER STONEY

Mr. Stoney, a bass-baritone, is music director and announcer for KBOY, here in Medford. He has appeared as Sharpless in "Madam Butterfly", Papagano in the "Magic Flute", the baron in "La Traviate". Mr. Stoney has appeared also in several theatrical productions here in the valley. He was a music student at the University of the South, at Sewanee, Tennessee.

CARMINA BURANA

The Benediktbeuren Manuscript

In 1803 an anonymous manuscript was discovered in the monastery of Benediktbeuren, near the Kochelsee in Upper Bavaria. It consists of pieces by 12th and 13th century wandering students - lyricists writing in Latin, Middle-High German and Old French - who were evidently brimming over with youthful anger, extremely earthy desires, determination to accept the challenge of life, and delight in parody. Prize songs on the subjects of Springtime and love, mocking verses and uproarious drinking songs - products of youthful revolt against the rigidly conventional medieval world - are brought together into a three-part cycle framed by an appeal to destiny ("O Fortuna"), and singing of man's encounter with nature in the first part ("Veris leta facies"), with the joys of wine in the second part ("In taberna"), and finally with love ("Amor volat undique"). The songs of the wandering poets reflect, in impulsive and sometimes crudely direct language, lives dominated by the ceaselessly turning wheel of destiny. Fortuna and Ananke, medieval Germany and Ancient Greece meet in this defiant yet fatalistic attitude to life.

Carl Orff gave his "Carmina Burana", which received its first performance at Frankfurt on Main in 1937, the sub-title "Cantiones profanae cantoribus et choris cantandae comitantibus instrumentis atque imaginibus magicis". This expressed his intentions: not merely to produce a "setting" of secular song texts from the Benediktbeuren manuscript, but to create magical pictures which, employing all the resources of the theatre, conjure up that ecstasy which the drama of antiquity was intended to create. An enhanced feeling for life, akin to the fiery passions of the wandering scholar writers, is meant to replace romantic illusions concerning the medieval world. The life force and fate's unfathomable depths are celebrated two fundamental concepts of Orff's dramatic works.
