LYNN SJOLUND

Lynn Sjolund has served as Director of the Rogue Valley Chorale since its inception in 1973. His dedication to fine music is well known throughout Southern Oregon; in addition to being director of vocal music at Medford Senior High School, he has conducted many other music festivals and clinics throughout the Northwest. A past president of the Oregon Music Educator Association, Mr. Sjolund contributes many hours of community service, and is currently President of the Jackson County Community Concert Association.

A graduate of the University of Oregon, Mr. Sjolund was recently appointed by the University's School of Music to serve as a member of the Board of Directors of the University of Oregon Music Society. He has also taught at the U of O summer session as a quest instructor.

PROGRAM NOTES

WILLIAM BILLINGS, (1746-1800) born in Boston, a mere sixty-one years after the births of Bach and Handel, was an anachronism. His work is intensely primitive and crude and seems to be of a far earlier time; but in its simplicity, it has all the purity of line found in the spare New England churches, the great clipper ships or a Paul Revere bowl. During the Siege of Boston, both Revere and Billings were nine crow-flying miles away in Watertown, which became the Whigs temporary capital. Here Billings "sat down and wept" as he poured out his LAMENTATION OVER BOSTON. As a musical independent, Billings relished octaves and consecutive fifths and combinations of dissonance that were ahead of his time. At times he achieved eloquent and poignant expressions of grief colored by the almost gothic bent of the Puritan mind.

SAMUEL BARBER (1910-) born in Pennsylvania showed early musical talent when he filled an organist's post at the age of twelve. He acquired the major part of his musical education at the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia. He started composing seriously in his eighteenth year. Of Barber's many admirable qualities - his sense of musical design, his economy of means, logic of thinking-the most significant is his highly developed lyricism. As his talent ripened, he added poetic feeling. Between 1935-1937, he won the Pulitzer Fellowship and the American Prix de Rome for his musical talents. Through the years he has composed Symphonies, Concertos, Operas besides single songs, during which time he has received two Pulitzer Prizes and an Honorary Degree in music from Harvard. Barber is partial to music for the voice as he knows its potential and its limitations.
