### LYNN SJOLUND

Lynn Sjolund has served as Director of the Rogue Valley Chorale since its inception in 1973. His dedication to fine music is well known throughout Southern Oregon; in addition to being director of vocal music at Medford Senior High School, he has conducted many other music festivals and clinics throughout the Northwest. A past president of the Oregon Music Educator Association, Mr. Sjolund contributes many hours of community service, and is a past president of the Jackson County Community Concert Association. Mr. Sjolund received his degrees from the University of Oregon and has taken a year of study in Germany.

## MARVIN BELFORD

Dr. Marvin Belford, who now serves as the Chairman of the Music Department of Southern Oregon State College, has been on the college staff for nine years. Dr. Belford received his Bachelor of Art and Masters Degrees from Drake University of Des Moine, Iowa, and his Doctoral Degree from the University of Iowa.

## The Music of Giovanni Gabrieli

Most of Gabrieli's works were written for civic and religious ceremonies in the piazza of San Marco and in the cathedral. Composed with the splendor of arched ceilings covered with priceless gold mosaics, and sound that seemed to descend from heaven, each work used complicated voicing and sound-on-sound effects. In his instrumental writing, Gabrieli used different combinations of instuments to create movement and variety. His choral writing includes solos, organ continuo, large chorus, brass and a variety of sections with contrasting voicings. The effect is one of many small segments, like a mosaic, blended into one large, splendid statement.

The "Jubilate Deo" is a sacred symphony, published in 1597. "In Ecclesiis" was published in 1615 and follows a more complex form, but is also a sacred symphony.

## BACH: CANTATA NO. 4

The sacred cantatas of Bach were intended for the Sunday services in the various churches where Bach served as music director and organist. The text for Cantata 4 is a seven-stanza hymn by Luther. The melody that is used resembles one from the 12th century. Luther said: "Whoever wrote this hymn had the right conception of Easter. One ultimately tires of all songs, but 'Christ ist erstanden' must be sung every year. The Holy Spirit inspired the person who wrote this song."

"Christ lag in Todesbanden" is built from Luther's chorale, with only minor changes made by Bach. In each section the mood of the melody is varied to express the ideas of one verse of the text.

#### Sinfonia - Instruments

#### Verse I - Chorus

Christ lay in the bonds of death, sacrificed for our sins. He is again arisen and has brought life to us; therefore we shall be joyful, praise God and be thankful to him, and sing hallelujah! Hallelujah!

### Verse II - Sopranos and Altos

No man could conquer death among all mortal children. Our sin has caused all this; no innocence was to be found. Hence came death so suddenly and took power over us, kept us imprisoned in his realm. Hallelujah!

#### Verse III - Tenors

Jesus Christ, Son of God, has come in our stead and has done away with sin, thereby from death has taken all its rights and its power. Hence nothing remains but death's image; death has lost its sting. Hallelujah!

#### Verse IV - Chorus

It was a strange war, when death and life were struggling. Life retained the victory, it has swallowed up death. The scripture has proclaimed this, how one death devoured another. Death has become a mockery. Hallelujah!

#### Verse V - Basses

Here is the true Easter Lamb, that God has offered for us, which high on the tree of the cross is roasted in burning love; its blood marks our door. Faith holds this up to death, the strangler can no longer harm us. Hallelujah!

#### Verse VI - Sopranos and Tenors

The high feast thus we celebrate with joyous heart and rapture. The Lord lets it appear for us; He is himself the sun, who through the splendor of his grace wholly illumines our hearts. The night of sin has vanished. Hallelujah!

#### Verse VII - Chorus

We eat and live well on the true Passover bread; the old leaven shall not exist beside the word of grace. Christ will be the food and feed the soul alone, faith will live on no other. Hallelujah!
