Notes from the Tonductor



Because the sounds of children's voices and beautiful bells especially remind us of Christmas, the Chorale is pleased to have as

our guests the Cantare Chorus of the Rogue Valley Youth Choruses and the Melody Ringers Adult Bell Choir of the First United Methodist Church of Medford. We are grateful to them for participating with us in our annual "Christmas with the Chorale" concerts.

Often, when the famous composer Bach is mentioned, people think only of vast vistas of music. It is true that the choral works for which he is most famous are the Passions of St. Matthew and St. John and the Mass in B minor, but he also wrote many short pieces that often were sung by the congregation that he served. These shorter works immediately establish a feeling of awe, majesty, or sweet adoration. The group included in our program shows the wonderful variety that is available in only five brief numbers. We are singing some of the songs in German and you will notice how the texture of the pieces changes with the language. The translations will help you understand them as they would have been understood by the worshippers in Leipzig over 250 years ago.

One short but wonderful carol in the last set of numbers is by Benjamin Britten, considered the greatest of English composers since Henry Purcell, who wrote in the late seventeenth century. This brief, introspective anthem is part of a set of numbers called "A Boy was born in Bethlehem." Its text proclaims the wonder of the birth of Christ in short traditional phrases interspersed with "alleluias." Each section becomes more intense and then fades into an inspired, quiet major chord.


The Chorale is especially busy this season with extra events and planning ahead for our concerts in January. Mark your calendars now for January 19 and 20, when the group "lets down its hair" and warms up the winter evenings with tunes by George Gershwin and Cole Porter. These great American composers have given us hundreds of fine melodies and great lyrics. The Chorale and soloists will give you a taste of many of them.

About the Melody Ringers

The Melody Ringers are the advanced English Handbell Choir from Medford's First United Methodist Church. The choir was formed about 1976 and their current director, John Thomas, has directed this group since the 1980's. Choir members are adults from various professions and older teens from surrounding schools. They practice weekly for 11/2 hours. Over the years they have performed for retirement homes, nursing homes, the Festival of Trees, and at other local church events in addition to monthly at their own church services.

The Melody Ringers have performed solo pieces at the Rogue Valley Bell Festivals and attend the



Area X Bell Festivals, held every two years at college sites in Oregon, Idaho and Washington. At the festivals they not only attend classes but mass ring pieces with up to 600 other ringers under the direction of invited guest conductors. They have also been invited to solo ring at these events.

About the Tantare Thorus

The Rogue Valley Youth Choruses organization is dedicated to making a difference in young musicians' lives through positive experiences with quality literature, singing technique and exciting performances. The Cantare Chorus, formerly the Children's Chorus, was founded in 1982 by Doris Sjolund.

Cantare is comprised of approximately 75 auditioned treble singers in 5th-8th grades from regional public, private and home schools. This middle level chorus sings 2-4 part music from many cultures, languages and style periods and is committed to the achievement of the highest level of artistry. During the Fall and Spring seasons, the *Cantare* Chorus embarks on a school tour, performs in concert at the Rogue Valley Manor, and presents a culminating concert in the Medford area.



PAM NORDQUIST, CONDUCTOR

Pam Nordquist is founding director of the Rogue Valley Youth Ensemble (2002) and current director of the Rogue Valley Cantare Chorus (2004). She taught elementary and middle school music for 20 years in Kansas and the Portland, Oregon area. Since moving to southern Oregon in 2001, Pam has been active as a music substitute and accompanist for Medford schools and currently job-shares the choir teaching position at South High with Andrea Brock. She sings with the Rogue Valley Chorale and occasionally with the Southern Oregon Repertory Singers.

Mrs. Nordquist holds degrees from The Wichita State University (Rene Clausen), the Conservatory of Music-University of Missouri-Kansas City (Eph Ehly) and belongs to ACDA and MENC.

Pam's husband, Peter, is also a singer,

choral conductor, and assistant professor of computer science at Southern Oregon University. Together, Pete and Pam have an 8-year-old son, Andrew.

ANDREA BROCK, ACCOMPANIST

Andrea Brock is currently the choir director at South Medford High School, where she has been teaching since 1996. Before moving to Medford in 1996, Andrea received her Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree in Music Education from the University of Oregon. She also attended the University of Colorado-Boulder and studied for a summer at the Musique Conservatoire de Lyon in Lyon, France.

Andrea has been the accompanist for the Rogue Valley Chorale for nearly 10 years. She and her husband Andrew have two children, Keenan and Molly.

About the Thorale

Founded in 1973, the Chorale has flourished as one of the Rogue Valley's finest musical organizations. With over 100 members on its roster, it performs choral music of all types. Last year the Chorale opened the Craterian Ginger Rogers Theater's tenth anniversary celebration with two "standing room only" productions of 100 Years of Broadway. The next program, scheduled for January 19 and 20, has a similar theme as it presents music of two of America's most talented composers, George Gershwin and Cole Porter.

The Chorale has always enjoyed singing many kinds of music, acknowledging that both our patrons and our singers love variety. Audiences who heard and saw the recent production of Mendelssohn's Elijah are still raving about how effective and meaningful it was. The group has also presented the great masterpieces of choral music by Bach, Beethoven, Brahms, Handel, Mozart, Verdi, and others. In addition to five concert tours to Europe, most recently during July of 2006, the Chorale has appeared with the Britt Festival Orchestra and the Rogue Valley Symphony, and as a featured choir in New York's Carnegie Hall.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR



Lynn Sjolund is wellknown as a conductor and choral clinician. He has directed festival groups and adjudicated choruses around the country. His tenure

with the Chorale began with its founding and has been continuous, with the exception of three years when he was Director of Choral Studies at Loyola University in New Orleans. He has been a regular conductor for Rogue Opera and has served as president of the Oregon Music Educators Association and the Northwest Music Educators Association.

Locally he worked on the renovation of the Craterian Ginger Rogers Theater and he currently serves on a committee for the Oregon Community Foundation. He has conducted the Chorale at New York's Carnegie Hall, and in March, 2002, he received the "Award of Merit for a lifetime of excellence in choral music" from the Northwest American Choral Directors Association. In October, 2002, the Arts Council of Southern Oregon presented Lynn with its "Lifetime Achievement Award."
