



ABOUT THE ROGUE VALLEY CHORALE

In 1973, a group of 38 singers joined together to form the Rogue Valley Chorale. Now with a roster of well over 100 and an active choir of over 90, the group has continued to grow musically as well as numerically. Many of the world's great masterpieces have been sung for Southern Oregon audiences, including all of Bach's large works, Mendelssohn's *Elijah*, the requiems of Verdi, Bach, Mozart, Fauré, and Duruflé. In addition, it has performed Handel's *Messiah* several times and also his outstanding oratorios *Judas Maccabeaus* and *Israel in Egypt*. The Chorale has traveled to Europe on four concert tours and appeared as a featured choir in concert in New York's Carnegie Hall. The group is always looking for capable singers/musicians.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Lynn Sjolund is well-known as a conductor and choral clinician. He has directed festival groups and adjudicated choruses around the country. His tenure with the Chorale began with its founding and has been continuous, with the exception of three years when he was Director of Choral Studies at Loyola University in New Orleans. He has been a regular conductor for Rogue Opera and has served as president of the Oregon Music Educators Association and the Northwest Music Educators Association. Locally he worked on the renovation of the Oregon Community Foundation. He has conducted the Chorale at New York's Carnegie Hall, and in March of 2002 he received the "Award of Merit for a lifetime of excellence in choral music" from the Northwest American Choral Directors Association. In October of 2002 the Arts Council of Sothern Oregon presented him with its "Lifetime Achievement Award."



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
